



Refraction Test

The Refraction is part of an eye examination used to determine the focusing error of the eye and the proper prescription for glasses. Even though a Refraction is part of an eye exam, many medical insurances consider it to be a non-medical test and frequently will not cover the cost of this test.

Patients whose insurance does not cover Refractions are expected to pay for the Refraction fee of **\$39.00**, along with any co-payments or deductibles.

If you have any questions about whether your insurance will pay for your Refraction test, please ask our business staff.

If you plan to get a new prescription today be sure to circle yes and sign the slip that was given to you at the front desk and give it to the doctor's technical staff.

Please KEEP your slip until after you have seen the doctor!

No Show Policy

We encourage you to make every effort to keep your appointment. If you have an eye disease you may be causing further damage or injury by postponing your appointment. Our efforts to reschedule you may result in a long wait.

Please notify us at least 2 business days prior to your appointment date if you need to reschedule or cancel your appointment, so that we can make every effort to accommodate rescheduling your appointment as quickly as possible.

If you do not show up for your appointment and/or fail to give us a 2 business day notice, we will be unable to give you another appointment right away. Due to our extend booking of the doctor's schedule it could take up to 2-3 months before another appointment would be available. We suggest you call us as soon as possible to request another appointment.

Failure to cancel or reschedule 3 appointments without giving a 2 business day notice in one year could result in dismissal from our practice.

It is very important that you make every effort possible to keep your scheduled appointments because appointments are limited and your health is very important to us.
